### Education Trays

#### 1. What is it?

Stress liver, a laminated cut out of the virus, a pin to show how many can fit on a pin head, and a clear hose with cochineal, water, and glitter to represent the virus living in blood.

### 2. How do you get it?

Woven tourniquet, swab with drop of food colouring, variety of syringes ...one with sample 'blood', a disposable razor with food colour and sample hair for effect, spoon, swab, a temporary tattoo, toothbrush with 'blood'.

### 3. How do you prevent it?

Fit pack, *disposable* tourniquet, card with local NSP services, laminated vein care flyer showing the 'barbed' needle, clean disposable razor and toothbrush labelled 'mine', sample vein as per tray 1 but with messages 'shoot to the heart, new fit every hit and love your veins'.



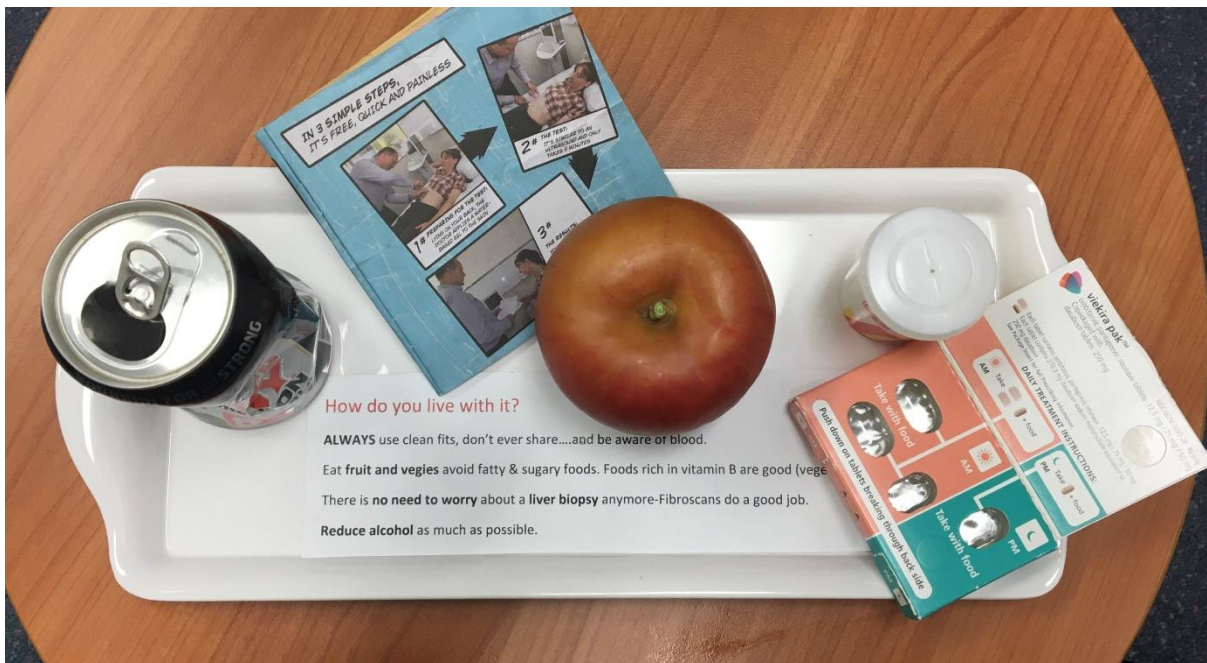

### 4. How do you live with it?

Can of Bundy /alcohol with 'cut down' sticker, fresh fruit, fit pack, and messages about ensuring you don't share with others, as well as where to go for treatment/advice.

### **5. What can you do about it?**

No visual aid available. This is where the health worker will start a discussion with the consumer about current treatments and screening services which leads into 'the first step is knowing your status and so the screening in SHC is a good start'. The worker can also introduce the 'new' generation hepatitis C treatments and the non-invasive tests to monitor liver health (i.e., indicating that liver biopsy is no longer required).
